Nottingham City Council will continue to:

- Provide meals to those who are registered with our Meals at Home service.
- Support schools to provide food, or food vouchers, to children in receipt of Pupil Premium – check with your school for details.
- Maintain our key responsibilities for child and adult social care and protection.
- Work with Trading Standards and the Police to investigate criminals who seek to exploit vulnerable people through scams and rogue traders.
- Collect household waste, maintain the transport networks and for as long as we can we will keep parks and open spaces available for use.

- Pick up groceries for people who are self-isolating – when you deliver them, knock and take 3 steps back from the door leaving items on the doorstep.
